Carswell (J.). Kütahya Tiles and Pottery. 2 vols., pp. 220, with 58 plates, 34 of them in colour, and 72 plans. 1971.

In A. D. 1718—1719, Armenian potters in Kütahya in north-west Turkey made a series of pictorial tiles for the restoration of the Holy Sepulchre in Jerusalem. Never used for this, the majority were instead set in the walls of the Armenian Cathedral of St. James in Jerusalem. This lavishly illustrated book catalogues the tiles and inscribed and dated Kütahya pottery throughout the world. There are separate studies of hanging ornaments, incense holders, Chinese porcelain tiles and Kütahya copies, potters' marks and a spectrographic analysis of various samples, including the famous Godman ewer (A. D. 1510) and waterbottle (A. D. 1527).

Chaumont (M.-L.). Recherches sur l'histoire d'Arménie de l'avènement des Sassanides à la conversion du royaume. Pp. 199, with a map. 1969.

Mathews (T. F.). The Early Churches of Constantinople: Architecture and Liturgy. pp. 280, with 100 photographic illustrations and 50 plans. 1971.

The first comprehensive attempt to reconstruct from archaeological liturgical and historical sources the ceremonial use of Early Byzantine architecture.

Mount Sinai. Catalogue of All Manuscripts in the Monastery of St. Catherine on Mount Sinai. Edited by M. Kamil. pp. 213. 1970.

This work lists manuscripts in Arabic, Syriac, Ethiopic, Greek, Slavonic and Georgian (and one each in Persian, Coptic, Latin, Armenian and Polish). In addition, a list of the manuscripts microfilmed by the Library of Congress, Washington, D. C., is included at the end of each section.
