Dr Takooshian is a Fellow of the American Psychological Association and has served as a national officer or President of Psi Chi (1993-2000), President of APA Divisions of International Psychology (2003) and General Psychology (2007), chair of the New York group of SPSSI, and a representative of APA to the United Nations. In 2010 Psi Chi honoured Dr Takooshian with the Florence L. Denmark National Faculty Advisor Award:
